



A Look in the Mirror

On Opening Day **The Cowboys** played a good game against a good team but lost by a run when **Hooters Outkast** scored two in the bottom of the final inning to beat us. This week we wanted to get back on track. To get back on track we faced the **White T's**, a young team transitioning from baseball to Softball. We went down 1-2-3 in the top of the seventh and lost the game, wondering what the heck had happened.

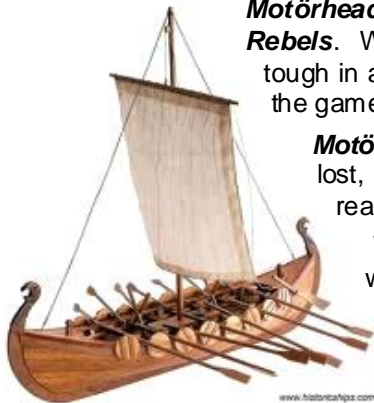

A walk followed the double then **Jerad** "Hammerin'" **Henry** singled home a run to put us up for the first time in the game, 4-3! A single and double each drove in runs to make it 6-3 then a walk loaded the bases with black shirts and the **A-Team** change pitchers. The new arm walked the first two batters on pitches way out of the zone and each walk drove in a run to increase our lead to 8-3. Finally, on our twelfth at bat, we got a fly-out, but two men scored on it and we led 10-3. A single and line-out followed as the new pitcher had settled in and begun to throw hittable pitches. "Invader" **Tim McCoy** added a two-out single to drive in the last run of the first inning and we led 11-3 after one. We batted sixteen times in the inning and nobody made an out in his first at bat. **Tim McCoy** was 2-2 in the first and **Dave Fisher** was on base twice with a walk and a single.

We held the **A-Team** scoreless in the top of two and scored one more run in the bottom half when **Sean** "Amusement" **Parks** busted a two-out triple and **Keith James** "Bond" drove him in to make it 12-3 after the second. We changed pitchers for the third inning, but just to get our backup a few innings and get out pitcher in the field for a bit. The **A-Team** welcomed our second pitcher the same way they had our first one, with three runs, reducing our lead to 12-6. We answered their three with a three, but not three runs. **Dave** "Sword" **Fisher** hit a two-out triple, but we didn't score him.

We stopped the **A-Team** dead in the top of the fourth and in the bottom half we got the bats going again. We started with back-to-back fly-outs then followed them with three straight singles to load the bases. A fourth single, this one from **Keith James** "and the Giant Peach" **, drove in a two-out run and we led 13-6, but **Mike** "Mighty" **Massey** did the real damage. The **A-Team** had had us shifted to the right side of the outfield the whole game, but had shifted to the left for Mike, who tattooed one into the wide open RCF gap and ran all the way to third for a two-out, three-run triple and we led 16-6! **Guarionex** "DP" **Montano** added a triple of his own to end the scoring and put us up 17-6.

The **A-Team** needed two to stay afloat in the game, but we handed them a donut and won 17-6!

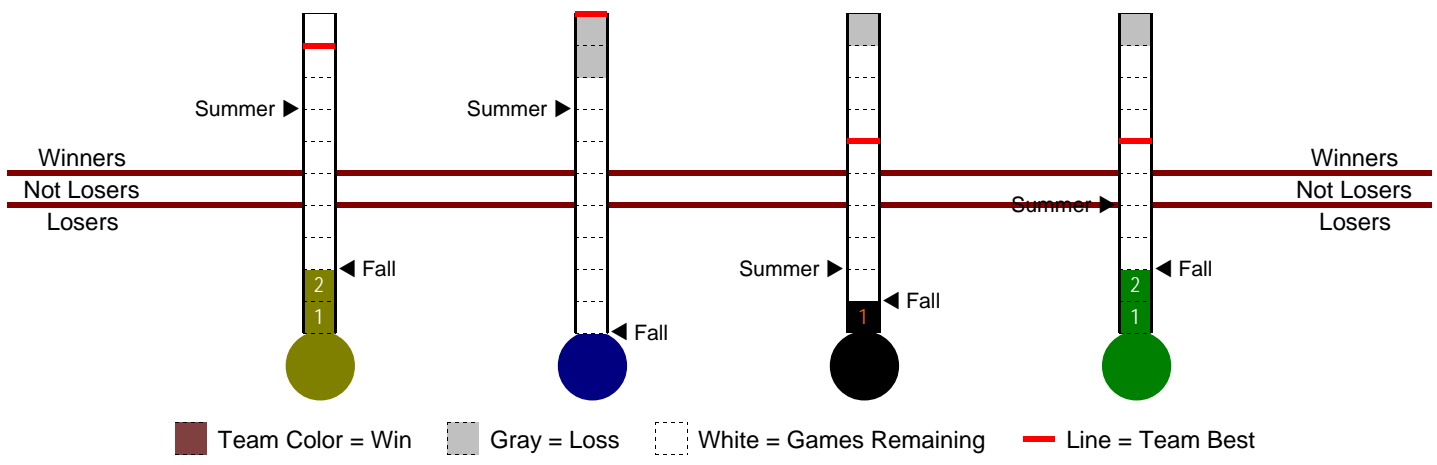

So, plan on playing a tough opponent Wednesday night. Let's focus and have fun getting lots of hits!

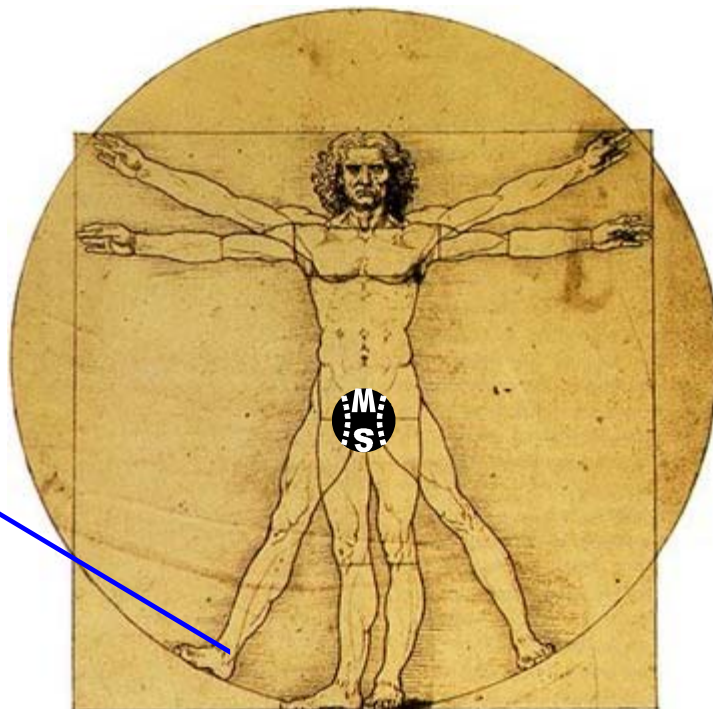

ASA Bat Testing & Certification Program

The official bat in ASA Championship Play must meet all of the requirements of Rule 3, Section 1 and:

1. must bear **either** the ASA approved 2000 certification mark **or the ASA 2004 certification mark** as shown below, and must not be listed on an ASA non approved list, **or**



2. must be included on a list of approved bat models published by the ASA National Office; or
3. must, in the sole opinion and discretion of the umpire, have been manufactured prior to 2000 and if tested, would comply with the ASA bat performance standards then in effect.

Beginning January 1, 2004, all bats in ASA Championship Play must pass the ASA 2004 bat standard. All bats having the 2004 certification mark will be allowed in ASA Championship Play. Bats that have the 2000 certification mark will not be allowed in ASA Championship Play unless they are listed on an approved bat list on the ASA website. For convenience, the ASA website has a listing of bats that do not pass the ASA 2004 bat standard.

2004 and Beyond Approved Bats (Updated: 12/5/2008)

For a list of bats that have been tested and found to comply with the ASA bat performance standards, and therefore are authorized to bear the **ASA 2004 certification mark** and/or are authorized for use in ASA Championship Play beginning January 1, 2004, please click on the manufacturer below. Manufacturers continue to submit additional bat models for testing, and the ASA will update this list as test results become available.

The ASA periodically and randomly tests samples of bat models bearing the ASA approved certification mark to verify compliance with the ASA bat performance standards.
