The Cowboys, Bethesda, 11/1/11, 6:30pm

Tuesday marked the end of Fall 2011 for *The Cowboys*. We were 4-4, having swept a double-header the previous week, and faced another double-header to finish the season. Just like the previous week, we faced a 6:30 game and an 8:30, and in each case we faced the tougher opponent in the second game.

This week, we played the *White T's* at 6:30 and *Goobo's* at 8:30. The *White T's* are a developing team, who got beat a lot in their first season, Summer 2011, but have become tougher and tougher as Fall 2011 went on. We beat them twice in Summer 2011, but they beat us the first time around in Fall 2011. We expected to even things up Tuesday evening.

We were Home team for the 6:30 game and hit the field long enough to hold the *White T's* to a lone run in the first inning. We had a donut in our half of the first and neither team was able to score in the second, so we were down 1-0 after two.

We held the *T's* in the top of the third inning, still 1-0 and quickly got our bats going in the bottom of three as we loaded the bases on three straight singles. We scored our first run on a fly-out, 1-1 and a fielder's-choice at third base gave us a second out. "Wild" **Bill Sarubbi** stroked a two-out, RBI double to put us up 2-1, but a fly-out ended the inning.

The *White T's* had an answer for our two-run rally in the third, by scoring five in the top of four, on base hits and a few gaffes in our defense. We didn't so much let them on base with errors, but we gave them too many extra bases on bad throws, extra throws or throws we should have made. Now down 6-2 we set to work in the bottom of the fourth to do some damage control with our sticks. We started off with a single, but back-to-back fly-outs threaten to sink us. A second single put runners on the corners then **Dave Fisher** "of Men" and **Mike** "Field of" **Reams** each smacked two-out, RBI singles and, just like that, we'd cut the *White T's* lead to 6-4. A line-out ended the inning, but not before we'd taken back a couple of runs we'd given away.

There was more of the same in the fifth inning as the *T's* kept base hitting and we kept missing slightly in the field. Three more runs went on the wrong side of the scoreboard and we trailed 9-4, mid five. We'd already figured out that we were not going to win that game on the strength of stellar defense, so we knew our bats would have to carry us. Ike "Broflovski" Smith carried a ball to the fence for a triple to get us started and a single picked up the spare, slicing that lead a bit to 9-5. Back-to-back fly-outs followed, advancing the runner, and "Raggedy" Andy Matz delivered a two-out, RBI single to cut the lead to 9-6. A fly-out ended the fifth inning, but we'd done a little damage.

We went to the sixth inning with lots of time still left on the clock, so we expected to have two more tries to get the lead back. We held the *T's* scoreless in the top of the sixth and now had a 10-6 hill to climb. We began our half of the sixth: fly-out, single, fly-out and it looked like another inning where runs would be at a premium. A two-out double put two runners in scoring position and a walk loaded the bags. **Ike** "Black" **Smith** was next up and hammered a gapper for a two-run double and the

hill got 50% smaller at 10-8! **Jason** "Fortune" **Tyler** leveled the field with a two-run double of his own and we were all tied up, 10-10! "Three Dollar" **Bill Sarubbi** gave us back the lead with a triple, 11-10, and a walk put men on the corners for **Andy** "Haz" **Matz**, who stroked a double to extend our new lead to 12-10! Another walk loaded the bases then **Mike** "Rollin', Rollin'" **Rowland** delivered a two-out, two run single and we now led 14-10! An RBI single from **Rock** "Hound" **McCoy** extended the lead to 15-10, but some questionable base running ended the inning. We batted thirteen times in the sixth, scoring nine runs, and **Rocky McCoy** was 2-2 in the inning.

Now it was the *White T's* turn to look up a hill. They had one more chance to score five or lose in the top of the seventh inning. They were definitely enthusiastic and seemed unimpressed by the circumstances facing them and rallied in the top of the final inning. Fortunately, our defense finally made an appearance to hold the *White T's* to two runs and we won the game 15-12!

A double drove in a pair to make it 4-0 and a ground-out plated a run to make it 5-0. A walk reloaded the bases, but a double-play ended the rally. We scored one in the top of the third on a couple of doubles, but **Goobo's** matched us, 6-2 after three. We scored the only run of the fourth inning on a bases loaded fielder's-choice, but weren't complaining because we led 7-2 after four innings. A couple of singles and a well placed fly-out got us two more runs in the top of the fifth inning and we held **Goobo's** scoreless to hold a 9-2 lead through five complete.

We started the sixth inning with a ground-out and line-out, but a double kept us going and seemed to pick us up. A single put 'em on the corners and a walk loaded the base for **Mike Reams** "Do Come True" who hadn't made an out all night. He continued his excellence at the plate and delivered a three run double and we led 12-2! **Andy** "Wrestling" **Matz** busted a deep shot for a triple, scoring Mike, but a ground-out ended the top of the sixth, though we'd built our lead four runs higher, 13-2!

There were four minutes left in the game when **Goobo's** batted in the bottom of the sixth inning, so it was 50-50 whether there'd be a seventh inning. **Goobo's** burned up the last of the clock in the bottom of six, scoring one run, and we won the game 13-3!




The **Jets** finished a disappointing 5-5 in Fall 2011, but the news wasn't as bad as our record would indicate.

Attached is the first page of the ASA webpage concerning Illegal Softball bats. Make sure your bat has the proper stamp. If you're not sure, check the ASA website.

ASA Bat Testing & Certification Program

The official bat in ASA Championship Play must meet all of the requirements of Rule 3, Section 1 and:

1. must bear either the ASA approved 2000 certification mark or the ASA 2004 certification mark as shown below, and must not be listed on an ASA non approved list, or





2. must be included on a list of approved bat models published by the ASA National Office; or

3. must, in the sole opinion and discretion of the umpire, have been manufactured prior to 2000 and if tested, would comply with the ASA bat performance standards then in effect.

Beginning January 1, 2004, all bats in ASA Championship Play must pass the ASA 2004 bat standard. All bats having the 2004 certification mark will be allowed in ASA Championship Play. Bats that have the 2000 certification mark will not be allowed in ASA Championship Play unless they are listed on an approved bat list on the ASA website. For convenience, the ASA website has a listing of bats that do not pass the ASA 2004 bat standard.

2004 and Beyond Approved Bats (Updated: 12/5/2008)

For a list of bats that have been tested and found to comply with the ASA bat performance standards, and therefore are authorized to bear the ASA 2004 certification mark and/or are authorized for use in ASA Championship Play beginning January 1, 2004, please click on the manufacturer below. Manufacturers continue to submit additional bat models for testing, and the ASA will update this list as test results become available.
